## AT THE SNACK TABLE....

### **Susie's spinach dip recipe: Mix together & chill:**

- 16 oz. sour cream (Susie prefers "Knudsen's")
- 1 cup mayonnaise (Susie uses "Best Foods")
- 1 package Knorr's Vegetable Soup Mix (dry) note: not their "Spring" veggie soup mix!
- 1 10 oz. package frozen CHOPPED spinach
- 2 green onions, chopped
- 1 small can water chestnuts, drained & chopped

Note: Susie made a point of the various brands she used. I included her recommendations, of course. Serve chilled; thin slices of baguette bread go well with this dip! The sliced bread served with this dip at the meeting came in bags, pre-sliced, from Knob Hill Foods in PG.

### MARKING YOUR TOOLS

It makes sense to mark your tools if you ever lend them to friends or take them out to classes or workshops. The question is, how to mark them permanently. For metal tools, I use a very small ball bur running fast in the Dremel or Foredom to "engrave" my initials. Other times I'll form the initials with a number of hits with a center punch.

For hammer handles and other wooden tools, the country boy in me came back and thought "Why not make a branding iron?" If you'd like to try one, all you need is a little scrap copper or nickel about 22-24 gauge, a piece of heavy brass or copper for a base, about 6 inches of metal rod and a piece of wood for the handle.

I formed my initials from a couple 4mm strips of sheet nickel. The "S" was one piece, but the "B" was three pieces soldered together with hard. (Remember to form the letters backwards). I then soldered the letters with medium onto a piece of 1/8 inch thick brass bar to act as a heat sink. Finally, I soldered a piece of 1/8 round rod on the back of the brass bar as a shaft to join to a wooden handle.



# OCTOBER MEETING SLIDESHOW PRESENTATION: A TRIP TO GERMANY, BY JIM & NANCY BRACE-THOMPSON




Jim & Nancy came all the way from Ventura again to tell us about their trip to Idar-Oberstein, world famous for its cutting and faceting, but especially for its agates! President Susie H.'s dad had his benitoite faceted there 50 years ago. *Jim writes:* Idar-Oberstein is especially significant because it's there that our modern form of agate cutting and crafting began over 500 years ago. The first legal document registering a gem-cutter in this area dates to 1497! The methods they developed and used are the same we modern rockhounds and lapidary artists use with our rock saws and grinding and polishing units.

A restaurant immediately outside of the Museum Idar-Oberstein serving up spießbraten, a Brazilian delicacy (neck of beef or pork roasted on a spit over a beech wood flame) that's been adopted as the official meal of Idar-Oberstein; it was brought back by immigrants who also brought back Brazilian agates, saving the Idar-Oberstein agate factories in the early 1800s when the local supply of agates was playing out.



A cartoon that was in one of the display cases at the 49<sup>th</sup> Annual Munich Show (Mineralientage Munchen), illustrating that rockhounds the world over are crazy fellows, with an odd sense of humor...



Two Tyrolean folk musicians (from the Austrian Alps) inspired folk dancing in the halls at the Munich Show, which is often referred to as "The Tucson of Europe."








